Why Do They Call Us Expert?	Description: An expert is a person with specialized knowledge, skill, experience, training, or education that qualifies that person to form helpful opinion(s) which will be relevant to the issues in the case, is reliable and will be helpful to the trier of fact. A relatively small but essential part of the forensic expert's responsibilities involves testifying about the scientific basis of analyses, findings, and conclusions in anticipation for litigation during a deposition or in court. An effective expert must understand the dynamics of trial, possess excellent communication skills and have a full command of the litigation process. To evolve from neophyte to effective seasoned expert, one must shed common misconceptions about the expert's role and learn to avoid common mistakes. The purpose of this study was to use a research method to study the media coverage of stroke and chiropractic using Google news search to find prevalence of media and determining the effect of bias on Search Engine Ranking Page (SERP). The results will then be compared to Google new search for 2015 vs 2016, when a high profile celebrity died purportedly after SMT.
